The easy part of the New Year's Eve get-together tradition is raising your glass in toast. The hard part is saving something coherent.



Don't worry; there's plenty of advice out there.

Keep it short, don't offend anyone, use humor sparingly and rehearse, say the wits at eHow.com.

In other words, you don't want to be toasting the virtues of family or loved ones if your best friend's wife just filed for divorce.

Be sincere, be sensitive to your audience and avoid clichés, is the advice from Toastmaster's International

"The best toasts are heartfelt," said Janice Oakley, vice-president of education for Santa Rosa's Downtown Toastmasters Club. "The nicest toasts are

those that are personalized by the giver."

Another no-no is singling out individuals and talking about what's coming up in the New Year for them, or what happened to them in the past.

Examples: "So and so had such a bad year, this year has to be better," or "Hey Jim, maybe you'll get over something this year, versus last year," according to Tracy Goodwin, a selfprofessed public speaking expert with a series of YouTube videos.

A New Year's Eve toast ideally is a blanket statement that everyone in the room can relate to, she said.

"Who's my audience and what will they connect with?" is how to approach the toast, said Bob Bergman, a retired educator and official with Santa Rosa's Downtown Toastmasters Club.

Begin with finding some good quips and quotes to personalize your toast, Bergman said. It's not stealing, per se. More like borrowing the tried and true.

There are a number of these witticisms in the public domain, such as "The New Year is like a new baby: many changes will be necessary, some of which will be neglected."


And, "What the New Year brings us will depend a great deal on what we bring to the New Year."
